



## **About Gallery Route One**

GRO is a nonprofit 501(c)3 organization that maintains an alternative art gallery and supports two community service programs. The gallery and its programs are operated by a Board of Directors, a small, part-time staff and 20+ artist members.

In addition to exhibiting work by member artists, the gallery exhibits work year round by artists from the Bay Area and beyond on themes focused on the environment, immigration and social justice issues.

GRO hosts the annual Box Show, holds a Juried exhibition for Northern California artists annually, and serves the West Marin Community through its ongoing Latino Photography Project and its Artists in the Schools Program.

GRO was founded in 1983 by 25 artists. Artist members are integral to the organization. Our goal: to support a professional-level exhibition space, offer a gathering place for artists, and serve the community through the visual arts.

In an average year, GRO presents 21 exhibitions in its 3 gallery spaces. Exhibitions are six weeks in length. Over 12,000 people visit GRO during the year, including 5,000 who come to see the annual Box Show. The Gallery Store sells American artisan-made arts & crafts.

GRO, now celebrating its 33rd year, receives a high level of recognition and support in the West Marin community and the Greater Bay Area for sponsoring innovative exhibitions and community service projects.

The gallery is open free to the public from 11 am to 5 pm every day except Tuesday.

Our mission: To originate and present contemporary art exhibitions, educational programs and community outreach in order to inspire people to experience the world in new ways.

# Fellowships for artists 21 to 35

Gallery Route One will award two fellowships for 2017-18. Applicants are automatically entered for both fellowships. The fellowship program offers both Senior Fellow and Emerging Fellow the opportunity to be part of a working gallery, to have one solo exhibition and to exhibit work in group exhibitions during the course of the fellowship year.

The Senior Fellow will have a solo exhibition in the Center Gallery space and a \$350 stipend to offset the associated costs. The Emerging Fellow will have a solo exhibit in the Annex Gallery. During the fellowship period, both fellows will have the opportunity to exhibit in member group shows and in the Alcove (small works gallery).

Fellowship Period: July 1, 2017 – June 30, 2018

**Eligibility:** Artists living in the Greater San Francisco Bay Area, convenient to Point Reyes Station, ages 21-35, working in any fine art medium; no crafts.

#### Application Fee: \$10.00

**Application Deadline extended to:** May 13, 2017 Notification for round one: May 15, 2017. Finalists will be invited to a personal interview and review of artwork.

**How to apply:** Applicants may apply online at www.galleryrouteone.org/call-to-artists/ or use this form to mail or hand deliver applications to GRO. Submit visual material on thumb drive. Video artists should use the mail-in form and submit clips no longer than 5 minutes each.

**Work requirements, gallery activities:** Fellows are required to attend 4 member meetings per year, and are invited to participate in gallery functions such as openings and salons. The Senior Fellow is expected to staff the gallery once every six weeks. The Emerging Fellow will assist in one or two gallery chores. The Senior Fellow must cover the cost for printing a small postcard and host the reception for their solo exhibition; this is not required for the Emerging Fellow.

We invite Fellows to apply to become full members of GRO after their 12 month Fellowship ends.
