

12-Month Fellowships for artists 21 to 40

An opportunity to become involved in the life of a working art gallery, to have a solo exhibition of your work and participate in group exhibitions at Gallery Route One in Point Reyes Station, Marin County.

Who may apply: Artists living in the Greater San Francisco Bay Area, convenient to Point Reyes Station. Because the Fellowship requires active participation and presence in the gallery, artists must have their own means of transportation.

Media: We will consider artists working in all fine arts media including video and installation; no crafts.

When to apply: Application deadline is July 1, 2020 Notification for round one will be in Mid July, 2020 Finalists will be invited to a personal interview and review of artwork.

How to apply: Application is online at submittable.com or through our website galleryrouteone.org/call-to-artists/

Fellowship Period: August 1, 2020-June 30, 2021

Gallery Route One will award two fellowships for the Fellowship period. Applicants are automatically entered for both fellowships.

Exhibition Privileges: The Senior Fellow will have a solo exhibition in the main gallery space, and a \$400 stipend to offset the associated costs. The Junior Fellow will have a solo exhibit in another gallery area with a stipend of \$200. During the fellowship period, both fellows will have the opportunity to exhibit in member group shows and in the Small Works Gallery.

Work requirements and gallery activities: The Senior Fellow is required to serve as gallery attendant once every 6 weeks. The Emerging Fellow will be asked to assist with one or two simple gallery chores. Both Fellows are required to attend 4 member meetings per year. Fellows are invited to participate in gallery functions such as openings and salons. The Senior Fellow must cover the cost for printing a 5x7 gallery postcard for his/her solo exhibition. A postcard for the Annex Exhibition is optional for the Emerging Fellow. The Senior Fellow is expected to host the reception for his/her solo exhibition.

GRO invites Fellows to apply for full membership after the 12 month Fellowship is completed.

About Gallery Route One

GRO is a nonprofit 501(c)3 art organization maintaining an alternative art gallery and community service projects. The gallery and its programs are operated by a Board of Directors, a small, part-time staff and 20+ artist members.

In addition to exhibiting work by member artists, GRO exhibits works work in the Project Space year round by artists from the Bay Area and beyond on themes focused on the environment, immigration and social justice issues.

GRO is the home of the annual Box Show, holds a Juried exhibition for Northern California artists annually, and serves the West Marin Community through its Latino Photography Project and its Artists in the Schools Program.

The organization was founded in 1983 by 25 artists who joined together to operate a professional-level exhibition space, offer a gathering place for artists, and to serve the community through the visual arts.

Our mission: To originate and present contemporary art exhibitions, educational programs and community outreach in order to inspire people to experience the world in new ways through art.

In an average year, GRO presents 21 exhibitions in its 3 gallery spaces. Exhibitions are six weeks in length. Over 12,000 people visit GRO during the year, including 5,000 who come to see the annual Box Show. The Gallery Store sells American artisan-made arts & crafts.

GRO, now celebrating its 37th year, receives a high level of recognition and support in the West Marin community and the Greater Bay Area for sponsoring innovative exhibitions and community service projects.

The gallery is open free to the public every day from 11 am to 5 pm except Tuesday.
